Volunteer Role Description

About Calgary Pop-Up Care Village (C-PUCV)

C-PUCV is a festival for anyone experiencing systemic vulnerabilities such as homelessness and addiction. It is a collaborative initiative supported by BeTheChangeYYC and modelled after LavaMae's Pop-Up Care Village in the San Francisco Bay Area. The festival provides equitable access to basic services such as case management, healthcare, clothing, haircuts, food and more to the street. The one-day event, held at minimum once per year, upholds guests' inherent human dignity and bridges the wider Calgarian community with the underserved population.

This volunteer position requires a commitment to one orientation session prior to the event and minimum of one shift on the day of the event (January 24, 2023). The position reports to, and is supported by, the Medical Team Lead and works in collaboration with external partners: St John's Ambulance.

Volunteers of the Medical First Response Central Team will respond to medical related issues alongside our St. John Ambulance Medical First Response partner. Volunteers will primarily be at the First Aid station and move about the event as needed. EMR, PCP, ACP designations or other similar medical designations are required for this role.

Responsibilities

- complete orientation session prior to the event
- on the day of the event, arrive 10 minutes early for your shift
- patrol the event site and notify the Team Lead of any medical related issues
- respond to medical related incidents as needed
- manage the First Aid Station as delegated
- anything else?

Criteria for Success

The following will contribute to success in this role

- registered medical professional such as: Doctor, LPN, RN, NP, EMR, PCP, ACP
- value and respect for diversity and lived experiences, with a trauma-informed lens
- perform well under pressure + in a team environment
